<u>CALENDAR - SAINTS OF THE WEEK</u>

23rd April – The Solemn Commemoration of St George the Martyr and Patron of England: He died about 303, martyred in Palestine during the period of persecution of the Emperor, Diocletian. He died in Lydda, now Lod near Tel Aviv, Israel. Legend

depicts him killing the dragon, a symbol of triumph over evil. He is the Patron Saint of several countries and regions, including England.

25th April – St Mark the Evangelist

THOUGHTS

The theme of the Good Shepherd appears in the Gospel of the Fourth Sunday of Easter throughout the Lectionary's three year cycle. The passages proclaimed all come from chapter 10 of St John's Gospel.

In this year's extract Jesus shows himself to us as the Good Shepherd, an image used by John to explain what it means to be a faith community. It is about our shared trust in Christ who puts his life on the line to care for his flock and keep them secure. It is about a flock that can be open and welcoming to others without fear for its safety because the one who laid down his life for them has taken it up again as the Father commanded.

Traditionally known as Good Shepherd Sunday, today is kept as the World Day of Prayer for Vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life.

The Gospel imagery of the shepherd is somewhat challenging for us today. The Palestinian shepherd lived with his sheep, knew them by name, defended them from wolves and from robbers.

We are reminded of Pope Francis' admonition that priests and Bishops should, "have the smell of the sheep"! Jesus portrays himself as the Good Shepherd caring for his flock to the point of dying for them. The sheep are, in the first instance, the people of his own tradition but John's account takes the imagery further: the sheep that are not of this fold are the Gentile people.
