<u>SAINTS OF THE WEEK</u>

2nd May – Athanasius: Fourth Century Bishop and Doctor of the Church. Bishop of Alexandria, exiled several times.

3rd May – St Philip and St James: Apostles and martyrs. Philip was born in Bethsaida, formerly a disciple of John the Baptist, he became a follower of Jesus. James, son of Alphaeus and cousin of Jesus, led the Church in Jerusalem and was martyred there in AD 62.

4th May – The English Martyrs of the Reformation: on this day in 1535 there died at Tyburn three Carthusian monks, the first of many martyrs. Of these, forty-two have been canonised and a further two hundred and forty-two declared Blessed, but the number of those who died on the scaffold, perished in prison or suffered harsh persecution for their faith over a century and a half cannot be accurately reckoned. They came from every walk of life, among them rich and poor, married and single, men and women. They are remembered for the example they gave of constancy in their faith and courage.

THOUGHTS

The celebration of Christ's Resurrection continues with festivity and joy. Each year on the Third Sunday of Easter the Gospels proclaim a post-Resurrection appearance of Jesus in which he shares a meal with his disciples. The Eucharistic theme is obvious and we celebrate the fact that through the Paschal Mystery Christ found a way to remain with us through this mystery of our

faith.

John's Gospel recounts the breakfast that Jesus shared with his disciples at the sea shore. The longer form of this weekend's Gospel recounts Peter's redemption from his denial of Jesus. Jesus asks three times if Peter loves him. Of course, we know Peter's answer, given three times; once for each time he denied Jesus the night he was arrested.

Peter's "yes" is also ours as we continue to follow our Risen Messiah throughout Easter .

The First Reading gives us an example of the initial preaching of St Peter as the Gospel spread immediately after the Resurrection. In this weekend's reading we hear, once again, Peter's response to the Sanhedrin's charge to cease preaching in the name of Christ.

Our second Reading is now a continuation of John's heavenly vision from the Book of Revelation and it tell us of the Lamb whose praise is sung by a countless number of angels. Not only this but all the voices of creation join in this song of praise to the Mighty One who was seated on a throne and to the Lamb!
