CALENDAR - SAINTS OF THE WEEK

19th January - St Wulstan: Wulstan was born in Warwickshire about 1008 and died in 1095. He became a Benedictine monk of the Cathedral Priory of Worcester, but in 1062 was appointed bishop, and was one of the few Anglo-Saxons in high office to survive the Norman Conquest. He was renowned as a confessor, for his care for the poor and sick and for the high standards he demanded of his clergy.

20th January - St Sebastian: The last great persecution of the Christians in Rome was under the Emperor, Diocletian, between 303 and 305. It was at this time that Sebastian, a

native of Milan, was martyred in Rome.

21st January - St Agnes: martyred at the age of twelve or thirteen, according to St Ambrose, around the year 300.

24th January - St Francis de Sales: born into a noble family in Annecy in 1597, he was ordained priest and worked strenuously for the Church by distributing printed essays on the Catholic faith; he became Bishop of Geneva, exemplary in his pastoral care. He also wrote "The Introduction to the Devout Life", a handbook of holiness. He is the patron saint of journalists and writers.

THOUGHTS

From the Society of St Gregory

It may be a new Liturgical Season of Ordinary Time but the Liturgy for our Mass this weekend continues the theme of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord commemorated last weekend.

The Readings we will hear at Mass this weekend tell us that Christ was the perfect servant of the Father and that we too become

servants of the Father's will, strengthened by the Blood of the Lamb of God. But Jesus was the only servant ever to fulfil completely the prayer 'Your will be done' for he freely accepted and gave himself up to death that others might share life through his sacrifice on the Cross.

Last week we heard Matthew's account of Jesus' Baptism and today we hear a passage from John's Gospel which reads like a

remembrance and reflection on what happened, using the words - some translations say witness, which adds authority - of John the Baptists. John does not recognise Jesus at first but he has been

waiting, preparing the ground for 'On one whom he sees the Spirit descend and remain'. It is John the Baptist who gives Jesus the title, Lamb of God.
