#### CALENDAR - SAINTS OF THE WEEK

Nov 17<sup>th</sup> - Saint Elizabeth of Hungary: born in 1207, daughter of the King of Hungary, she was married at the age of 14; after the death of her husband she embraced poverty, caring for the sick in a hospital she herself had built. She died in 1231.

**Nov 17<sup>th</sup>- Saint Hilda:** born in 614, outstanding early leader of the Church, she was Abbess of Whitby, which became a great centre of learning. She hosted the famous Synod in 664 - she loyally accepted the Synod's decision and followed Roman traditions thereafter. She died in 680.

**Nov 17<sup>th</sup>- Saint Hugh of Lincoln:** born in France in 1140 and a Carthusian; became bishop of Lincoln in 1185, and was devoted to the pastoral care of his flock - he even helped

build the Cathedral with his own hands. He was a supporter of the oppressed, especially the Jewish community, for whom he risked his life. He was declared a saint in 1220.

Nov 21<sup>st</sup> – Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary: this day saw the dedication in 543 of the Church of Our Lady near to the Temple in Jerusalem: together with Christians of the East we celebrate that dedication of herself which Mary made to God from her very childhood.

**Nov 22<sup>nd</sup> – St Cecilia:** the "Passion of Saint Cecilia" was written in the 5<sup>th</sup> century and tells that she suffered martyrdom with her husband and brother in the second century. Cecilia is the patron saint of music and musicians.

From the Society of St Gregory

Quite unusually, all the Readings provided for this Sunday and the general tenor of the Prayers for Mass are focussed on the Seconded Coming of Christ, a theme that will continue through into Advent. Now the apocalyptic imagery in the Gospel is matched by the prophet Malachi in the First Reading. But in the midst of this doom and gloom, the Psalm for Mass today proclaims that all created things should joyfully welcome the Lord who comes bringing both judgement and salvation.
