#### CALENDAR - SAINTS OF THE WEEK

8<sup>th</sup> April – The Solemn Feast of the Annunciation of the Lord (Lady Day) - nine months before Christmas: In both the Churches of the East and the West, the origins of this Solemnity can be traced to the of the Church. earliest centuries commemorates the appearance the of Archangel Gabriel to Mary. Gabriel announces Mary's chosen status, and she

answers with an assent, a version of which will later become a refrain for her son, "Let God's will be done in me". As always Mary points to Christ and her "yes" to God's will sets into motion the wonderful and great mystery of the Incarnation. Of course, as such, Mary's stance is the model that each of us is called to have before God: in faith and trust we are called to accept the will of God in our lives.

#### **THOUGHTS**

The command to "Do this in memory of me" is perhaps the most important instruction the Church has received from Jesus.

As the Anglican Benedictine monk, Dom Gregory Dix wrote in his 1945 classic "The Shape of the Liturgy":

'The celebration of the Eucharist has always been at the heart of the Church, irrespective of the circumstances in which Christ's disciples found themselves. For century after century, spreading slowly to every continent and country, and among every race on earth, this action has been done in every conceivable human circumstance, for every conceivable human need, from infancy and before it to extreme old age, and after it from the pinnacles of earthly greatness to the refuge of fugitives in the caves and dens of the earth. The Church has found no better thing than this to do for Kings at their crowning and for criminals

going to the scaffold; for armies in triumph or for a bride and groom in a little country church; for a schoolboy sitting an examination or for Columbus setting out to discover America.

And the best of all, week by week and month

by month on a hundred thousand successive Sundays faithfully, unfailingly across all parishes of Christendom, priests have celebrated with, and for, their people.'
