CALENDAR - SAINTS OF THE WEEK

2nd February - The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord - Candlemas

Day: Forty days after Christmas. In some Christian traditions this Feast Day marks the end of the Christmas Season.

3rd February - St Blaise: Very little is known about Blaise, except that he was the bishop of Sivas (Armenia) in the fourth century; he is associated with care for those in need and especially with the healing of afflictions of the throat.

5th February - St Agatha: was martyred in Sicily in the persecution under Emperor Decius (240-251). Devotion to her was

strong from the earliest times: a homily written about her says: "Good is the force and meaning of her name, Agatha in Greek, for she has been granted us, given as a gift, by God himself, the very fount of goodness."

6th February - St Paul Miki and Companions: the Japanese martyrs. Towards the end of the sixteenth century, the Emperor Hideyoshi began a persecution of the Catholic Church in Japan; among those arrested were Paul Miki, a young Jesuit, and twenty-five others, some as young as 13; they were taken to Nagasaki where they were crucified in 1597.

THOUGHTS

From the Society of St Gregory

This weekend, and for the next two Sundays, our Gospel passages will come from the Sermon on the Mount found in Matthew's Gospel Chapter 5.

The Beatitudes which we hear today are a very familiar text which Matthew places near the start of Jesus' public ministry. Each Beatitude describes an action or a life

situation that is rewarded by God.

When those who follow the Lord act in accordance with the subject of the Beatitudes then they will know God's blessing.

Psalm 146 (this weekend's Psalm)

You might say that all the scriptures this weekend are about ordinary people - there are no miracles, no great deeds, not even any

great wickedness! The greatness is in how people who are downtrodden, hungry, blind or cast to the margins of life are to be brought into the fulness of life.

In the Psalm for our Mass this weekend, it is the Lord who does the work, restoring sight, protecting the ones nobody cares for.

In the Gospel Reading it is the poor who are blessed, but also the ones who take up the call to care. This weekend, the Psalm aligns with the Readings so that this mystery may be broken open by Jesus by his preaching on the mountain what we know as the Sermon on the Mount.
