The disciples, gathered in the upper room, experienced the presence of the Spirit in such a profound way that it drives them out into the world to proclaim and preach the Gospel with courage unknown before.

Pentecost derives its name from Jewish Festival of the early harvest, the Feast of Weeks on which the first fruits were offered Paul tells the Christians of Corinth that he will stay in Ephesus until Pentecost, leading us to speculate that the very first generation of Christians commemorated the day every year.

The name means Fiftieth and in early Christianity referred to the whole 50 days of Easter, culminating with the celebration of Pentecost.
