CALENDAR - SAINTS OF THE WEEK

27th January - St Angela Merici: born in Brescia, Italy, around 1470, Angela entered the Third Order of St Francis and gathered girls around her to share the work of charity. She founded the Ursulines (who were devoted to education of poor girls) in Brescia in 1535 and died in 1540.

28th January - St Thomas Aquinas: Famous theologian, born in Aquino, Italy, around 1225; entered the Dominican Order and studied under St Albert the Great in Cologne;

outstanding writer and teacher of Philosophy; he died, aged forty-nine, in 1274. He had a great influence on the Western Latin Church.

31st January - St John Bosco: born near Turin in 1815, John was ordained priest and laboured to improve the education of young people, founding in 1859 a religious congregation, called the Salesians, for this purpose. We remember the Salesian community at Thornleigh College, Bolton.

THOUGHTS

From the Society of St Gregory

In this Sunday's First Reading there is another prophecy from Isaiah which will be fulfilled in the life and ministry of Jesus. We are familiar with this Reading from the First Mass of Christmas but today, rather than leading up to the birth of a child, the focus is on lands and people for whom things are changing from darkness to light, namely Zebulun and Naphtali beyond i.e. north of the Sea of Galilee and neighbouring regions. We

will hear these places named again in today's Gospel in relation to Jesus.

God has previously disdained them but in 'this latter time' it seems they are once again in favour.

Matthew's Gospel shows Jesus preparing for Ministry: he leaves town and settles in Capernaum on the shore of the Sea of Galilee in the region we heard of in the First

Reading today. Matthew says this in order to fulfil the words of the prophet.

The point is not so much the tying up of loose ends but to emphasise that, just as God was

active in the prophets long ago, he is still working in Jesus and it is now that Jesus begins to proclaim the Kingdom of God.

HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL DAY

Tuesday 27th January is commemorated as Holocaust Memorial Day when in 1945 the Concentration Camp, Auschwitz-Birkenau, in Poland, was liberated. Despite all the suffering that we cannot even begin to imagine, a prayer was discovered on a piece of wrapping paper beside the body of a dead child in another Concentration Camp, Ravensbruck, where many thousands of women and children were murdered.

O Lord, remember not only the men and women of goodwill but also those of ill-will. But do not remember all the suffering they

have inflicted on us, remember instead the good things that have come to us thanks to this suffering - our comradeship, our loyalty, our humility, our courage, our generosity, and the greatness of heart which have all grown out of this. And when they come to judgement let all the good things that have come out of this be their forgiveness.
