CALENDAR - SAINTS OF THE WEEK

We begin Week 1 of the Church's Year.

12th January – St Aelred of Rievaulx: of Rievaulx Abbey in Yorkshire where he became Abbot. He is celebrated for his Spiritual writings, especially on Christian friendship.

13th January – St Hilary: Fourth century Bishop of Poitiers who died in exile as a defender of the faith against heresy.

17th January - St Anthony of Egypt:

inspired by the words of the Lord, "Sell everything you own and give it to the poor", Anthony retired to the Egyptian desert at the age of twenty; he attracted many followers, who shared his ascetic life, and bequeathed to the Church an example of life spent in solitude and total devotion to prayer. He died in the year 356, aged about 105.

Next weekend - Will be the Second Sunday of Year A. Lent beginning on 18th February.

THOUGHTS

From the Source Book for Sundays and Seasons

The Baptism of the Lord is another epiphany, a manifestation of Jesus' identity to the public. The Feast Day of the Epiphany is when the gentile Magi recognise Jesus.

Today God proclaims him to be his beloved Son before those who witness his Baptism and this Feast concludes the Christmas Season.

Early writers and commentators in the generation after the Apostles indicate something of the relationship of the Nativity to

the Baptism of the Lord. 'If you rejoice to see Jesus in the lap of his mother Mary, rejoice today to see Jesus embraced by his heavenly Father.'

The Baptism of Jesus became difficult to explain early on. If Jesus is sinless why should he be baptised if Baptism represents the forgiveness of sin?

Matthew, Mark and Luke's Gospels all present it rather plainly and even the Acts of the Apostles refers to the event. John's Gospel that we will hear next weekend presents a less dramatic account of the same event. For the Church's Liturgy, the Baptism

is an image of Easter: Jesus takes on our mortality in order to make us immortal. Jesus is immersed in the chilly Jordan River as a

revelation of his "putting on" not just human flesh and blood but all creation, as well to set the world right and to restore Paradise.
