Playing	Play pitch-making games, humming our singing in short phases for children to copy. Play instruments with increasing control to express their feelings and ideas (30-40)	Begin to mark pulse and move rhythmically and tap out simple repeated rhythms. Explore how sounds can be changed. Join in and stop as appropriate.	Keep a steady pulse with accuracy and develop an understanding of the difference between pulse and rhythm. Play fast/slow, loud/quiet, high/low and change the type of sound when playing instruments Follow and offer simple musical instruments and actions to use when appropriate.

Performing	Offer opportunities for children to go to a live performance eg pantomime, play, music or dance performance. Provide related costumes and props for children to incorporate into pretend play.	Play an instrument as part of a group. Play a musical instrument in front of others. Composing and improvising	Discuss changes and patterns as a piece of music develops. Create their own songs or improvise a song around one they know (30-40) Sing the melodic shape (moving melody such as up and down) of familiar songs (30-40)	Use music and movement to express thoughts and feelings. Improvise (make up) patterns within a musical piece.	Make, change and combine sounds with voice, body instruments and appropriate technology. Order sounds within simple structure such as beginning/middle/end and in response to given starting points.

Notation and technology	Use simple music technology to make sounds. Recognise the link between sounds and symbols using graphic notations. (shape/pitch)	Use simple music technology to make and capture sounds. Repeat sounds with symbols (given and made up.)
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
